#### Where can I drop off my recyclables if I live in an apartment?

Single Stream or Mixed Recyclables can be dropped off at 1392 E Commercial Row, open Monday - Friday 7:30-3pm. While cardboard can be included in single stream recycling, loads of cardboard should be taken to 1100 E Commercial Row, open Monday - Friday from 7:30am to 3 pm, Closed 12-12:30 pm.
