While cardboard can be included in single stream recycling, loads of cardboard should be taken to [1100 E Commercial Row](#), open Monday - Friday from 7:30am to 3 pm, Closed 12-12:30 pm. What do I do if I see an illegal dumpsite?

You can report an existing illegal dumpsite by calling 329-DUMP (3867). You can also report individual(s) actively illegally dumping by calling 785-WCSO (9276).
